#### WHAT'S A RIGHT TO PLAY DAY?

Get your school together and have some fun with play – the rest is up to you! This guide will give you some **simple steps**, **activity ideas** and **stories** to help bring play to life at your school. This is a great chance for your pupils to develop skills like confidence, teamwork and creativity, as they learn about the challenges facing children around the world.

Enable self-expression and creativity through art, drama, music, roleplaying, performance and tinkering

Unlock the benefits of child-led play by providing access to safe, child-friendly play spaces

#### How fast can your pupils make a ball out of a long-sleeve shirt?

For some children, a long-sleeved shirt can rule the playground when their shirt becomes a ball for everyone to play with. Olympian Johann Olav Koss experienced this when he visited Eritrea, Africa over 20 years ago. This inspired him to create Right To Play and it's the story behind our shirtball logo!


## THE POWER OF PLAY

'When I play people cheer for me. I become more confident and stronger. It pushes me to improve myself and take a step toward being the star I dream of being.'

13-year-old Tala lives in the Al Khalidiyah, Jordan. She and the other girls there struggle daily against the reality that they don't have the same rights and opportunities as boys. While Tala was expected to stay at home to do housework, the boys her age were playing, learning and discovering who they wanted to be.

#### 'In our community, girls and boys are not equal.'

Tala wanted to break these barriers. She wanted to have the same chance to play, learn, grow and realise her dreams. After Right To Play programmes were introduced at her school, taking part in sports and games transformed her confidence. Now, Tala and her friends have a safe space to play. The more they play, the stronger they get.
